

Our profession has always embraced change and set its own course. We can only do so by committing ourselves to lifelong learning.

ach year as I lecture across the country, I am reminded how critical continuing education is to optometry. Whether I'm talking with a small group of colleagues in Springfield, Massachusetts, or standing on a large auditorium stage in Springfield, Missouri, I'm always reminded how education not only brings us together but also helps strengthen our profession and our standing in the medical community, both now and in the future.

Looking back at 2019, many of our colleagues worked tirelessly to ensure doctors of optometry in their respective states would finally be allowed to practice near the fullest extent of their training. Our neighbors in Arkansas won a contentious battle that finally allows their ODs to perform laser treatments, administer certain injections and take on other long-overdue privileges. We also celebrated scope of practice victories and hopeful soon-to-be wins in Iowa, Maryland, Minnesota, Nebraska, New York, Texas, Nevada and Alabama.

But despite the headway we've made, the profession continues to fight against critics who are trying to block our progress. In Arkansas, some opponents are continuing to fight the expanded scope of practice law and are working to get a voter referendum on the ballot in 2020 to have it rescinded.

With each step forward, many across the nation are looking closely at optometry's capabilities and training, hoping we will fall two steps back, as they falsely cite our lack of training to perform certain procedures and treatments.

This is just one critical reason continuing education is and will continue to be imperative for the growth of our profession. Whether you attend the large, multi-day conferences that attract thousands or a small CE event in your hometown, continuing education provides the clinical knowledge and hands-on know-how to bridge any gaps. From myopia management to courses on IOLs, glaucoma, dry eye and CXL—just to name a few—the depth of the courses being offered are varied and rigorous.

In 2020, more than 260 continuing education events will be offered from coast to coast and even at far-flung European destinations like Italy, Austria and the Netherlands. Wherever you practice, CE opportunities abound whether you want an experience among the vineyards in Tuscany or a traditional, regional meeting in the Midwest.

A clinical education highlight for me personally is my position as education chair of the New Technologies & Treatments in Eye Care series. These four meetings, scheduled throughout the year at strategic locations across the country, are known for their relaxed, collegial setting between the presenters and the doctors in attendance. Some want to get more knowledge about OCT imaging, while others want to learn more about glaucoma medications or cataract and refractive surgery comanagement all of which they can find at local and national conferences.

Whatever your interest, or how far you'd like to roam, 2020 offers a wide array of continuing education opportunities for you.

We hope this annual supplement to *Review of Optometry* will help shape your CE adventures for the year. I look forward to seeing you at a meeting in 2020!
