Finally, many optometrists have added nutraceuticals to their patient care efforts. However, the AREDS2 study has left many questions about ocular vitamins unanswered. 





For 2014, the AAO is considering an expansion of the "hot topics" sessions, where fresh, peer-reviewed progressive research that has immediate clinical application is highlighted, Dr. Bence says.

As technology evolves, the latest innovations will also be a key point of discussion at the 2014 meeting.




